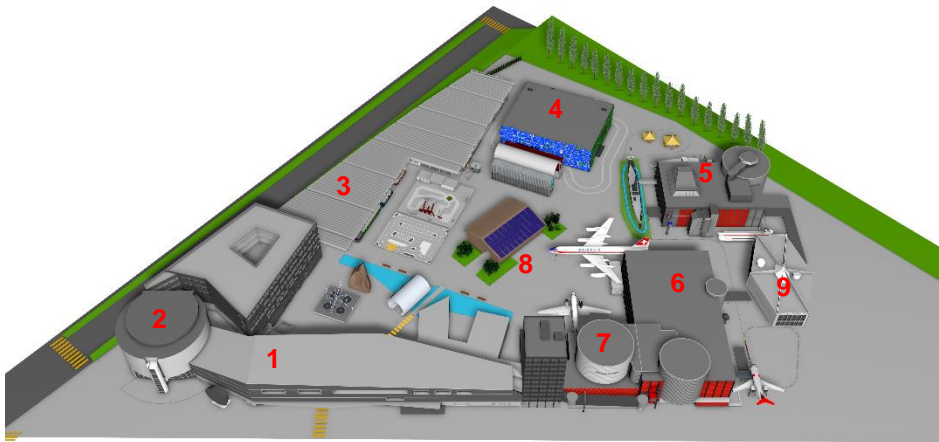


"Everything that's fun" - Cycle I

The programme for schools at the Swiss Museum of Transport is very varied and educational. However, learning objectives and the acquisition of knowledge do not always have to take centre stage.

In this compilation you will find an overview of the exhibition areas where fun and adventure are the main focus.

All attractions are included in the admission price, if this is not the case, it will be noted.

A selection of highlights for Cycle I is listed on the following pages, but there are of course many more "entertaining" areas depending on your interests!

Rail hall

Stoos funicular railway

The model of the Stoos funicular railway can be discovered via a climbing wall and a slide.



Coal shovels

The job of the stoker can be tried out in the form of a game. Try to shovel 100kg of coal in two minutes.



Giruno" train simulator

Travel through the Gotthard Base Tunnel from northern to southern Europe or vice versa with the train simulator. The simulator includes an original driver's cab.



Draisine game

The Draisinien game is all about having fun. The children can compete against each other in a race.



Combined transport

The "Combined Transport" theme island explains how goods are transferred from road to rail and vice versa. Children can try out the job of a crane operator for themselves in a simulator.



Road traffic hall

SEE YOU" mirror world

Mirrors, lights and reflectors provide greater clarity and safety on the road. But beware: they can also be distracting!



Carousel street hall

Even the youngest children will have fun on the carousel in signal colours.

The carousel can be put into operation at any time.



Picking Head Logistics

The logistics game "Picking Hero" requires quick thinking and action. You have to press the right buttons and scan the right goods in the shortest possible time. Are you a Picking Hero?



Galliker model

The miniature model invites children to playfully recreate the supply chain with models.



Experience hydrogen mobility

What is the difference between an old petrol pump (ca. 1940) and a modern hydrogen filling station? You can find out this and much more about hydrogen mobility and security of supply in the Road Transport Hall, where you can also take a trip back in time.

Get on your racing bike now and feel the real racing feeling.



Play island car

The very little ones can discover their love of cars on this play island. Various cars, garages and other shelters are available as accessories.



Shipping, cable cars and tourism hall

Ferry game

In this game, the children can load a ferry themselves.



Rowing game

In a competition, the children can compete against each other as well as against a steamboat.



Tourism pinball machine

An ingenious mechanical marble run shows the various tourist attractions in Switzerland.



Trip around the DS Rigi

On the Schiffli bach, children have the opportunity to walk around the oldest steamboat in Switzerland and climb up a rope ladder.



Livemap Switzerland (Swissarena)

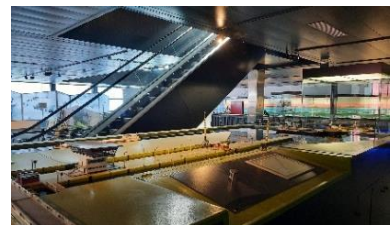
The walk-in aerial photograph allows children to get to know Switzerland better and project current, real-life events onto the map with the help of our new app. App:

Lock model

Navigation is only possible where the waterway does not exceed a certain gradient. With this model, pupils can observe directly on site how locks transport ships if the gradient is too steep



Nautirama

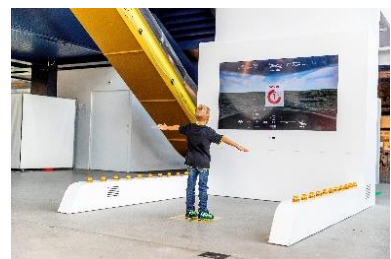
Embark on a 20-minute journey through the history of shipping and tourism in Central Switzerland. Enter the saloon of a paddle steamer, experience a medieval shipwreck and learn about the impact of industrialisation and the introduction of steam navigation on the Lucerne region.



Hall Aerospace

Swiss-Simulator

In the Swiss simulator, the task is to land an aeroplane safely at Zurich Airport. The children learn how sluggishly an aircraft can be steered.



Air traffic control

The children learn how challenging it is to secure and monitor Swiss airspace. The aim of the game is to guide an aircraft safely through the airspace using their own body and to fly past various obstacles. This requires skill and concentration.



Airport control

The children can use an X-ray machine to check various suitcases for prohibited items and playfully try to get the passengers' luggage onto the right aircraft.



Swiss Cargo

Children can discover the world of the airport and passenger transport in a playful way. The highlights are a walk-on conveyor belt and a slide that corresponds to the length of an original rescue slide.



Sim World

In Sim World, pupils can explore various flight simulators. From the Wright brothers' first aeroplane to the modern fighter jet.



Rega Kids Corner

The children's corner in the Rega exhibition offers various haptic games and a multi-touch table. This allows children to familiarise themselves with Rega in a playful way.



Hans-Erni-Museu

Painting island

Using paper and crayons in many different colours, the children create drawings to their heart's content. Each child can take their little work of art home with them.

Arena

Traffic garden

The traffic rules are explained to the children in a fun way in the traffic garden. They can put what they have learnt into practice straight away with the karts.

Play ship

The children can have fun on a real ship and slip into different roles.



Kids Cargo

Various vehicles are available here for the little ones. Children can "play" with global transport methods by transporting the containers with trains, lorries, ships and planes.



Garden railway (subject to charge)

The journey starts at the station of the Hans Erni Museum and passes various locations. In addition to the steam locomotive, there is also an SOB diesel locomotive.



Sky-Jumper (subject to a charge)

Children can experience a feeling of weightlessness on the large trampoline in the arena. The ten-minute jump into the sky costs 10 francs.



Planetarium (subject to charge)

Offers an insight into the realm of the stars using modern technology. Daily shows for every age group:
